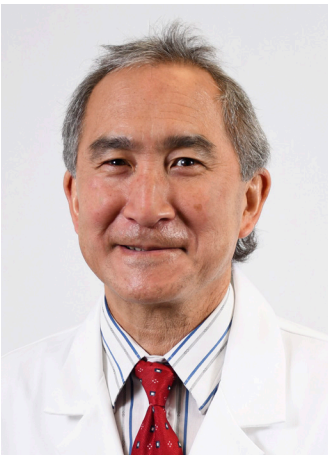
Sally Hinman, MD, PhD, CAQ-SM

Sports Medicine Fellowship Director

Sally Hinman, MD, PhD, CAQ-SM, completed the Medical Scientist Training Program at the Indiana University School of Medicine. She earned her PhD in Cellular and Integrative Physiology.
