- Cognitive disorders resulting from disease, injury, or birth defects

Primary areas of focus include:

- Treating deficits in verbal expression
- Understanding of language
- Reduced speech intelligibility
- Swallowing deficits
- Weak or disordered voice
- Decreased cognition

Our Speech Therapists are specialty certified in treating voice and swallowing disorders, improving oral motor weakness or dysfunction, and finding the appropriate augmentative communication devices. Family training and counseling is also provided to improve patient and family interaction and help the patient achieve maximum recovery of his/her communication, cognitive, or swallowing skills.
